




Right after we finally got our food, the weather got better, and we got a chance to dry off a bit. Some of us even made their dreams come true.




7th October

In the morning we took a bus to the cinema where we watched a movie from schoolchildren.




Then we went to see the lookout tower by the sea. Where the atmosphere was beautiful and then we arrived hungry for lunch with 3 courses.





Under the restaurant at the castle was a large ancient wine bar with an explanation.








And then we finally arrived at the school where we released our balloons accompanied by national anthems, which we worked on all week.










8th October

We made memories but not pictures so imagine something here








Even though we didn't want to go home, we flew back to the Czech Republic with a vision of our home and a fear of the election results.
